RULES:

Go to <http://www.cheeryacres.com> to enter your classes. Click on your division on the left-hand side of the page and add the classes you wish to enter into your cart. You may enter as you go throughout the month.

- Film your video, add the class to your cart, provide your video link and pay your fee. Entry Fees are \$12/class, including jackpots. **Optional Judge's Feedback fee is \$3 per horse/rider combo, per division. Those that ride Dressage tests, unless you pay for feedback you may or may not receive a dressage scorecard, this is judge's discretion.**
- **Must enter one other class in the show to be eligible for jackpot class prize money. Any class will suffice.**
- Entry fees are paid at the time of entry. Cheery Acres accepts Paypal, Venmo, Google Pay, Apple Pay and Stripe. Payment will be made via your cart on the website at the time of entry.
- You must use a video service such as YouTube, Google Photos, Apple or vimeo to assign your video a link. Please remember to mark your YouTube Videos as "unlisted." This allows only those who have the link to view the video and will not allow the public to search your video. If you have your video marked as private and un-viewable by the judge, the entry may be disqualified.
- Back Numbers will be issued to each horse/rider combo. These DO NOT need to be displayed, they are for administrative purposes. You may include the back number in your video title if you would like. Back number will be issued after you have entered your first class and may be used throughout the series, as well as with the [Patternpalooza Online Horse Show Series](#)
- It is highly suggested that exhibitors become members of the Cheery Acres Online Horse Show Facebook Group page. Updates and show information will be posted there as Facebook allows. www.facebook.com/groups/cheeryacres
- No REFUNDS. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure videos are assigned to the correct class by properly labeling them. All other refund requests will be decided on a case by case basis.

- SAFE tack is required for the discipline you are riding in. No mixing of tack. Dressage saddles and cutback saddles are allowed in the Hunter type pleasure classes.
- Bitless bridles are legal for all classes but Classical Dressage. They must be true bitless bridles - halters and lead ropes or similar setups are not considered bitless bridles and will result in disqualification.
- Any age horse may be ridden in a bitless bridle, bosal, snaffle bit, or shanked bit. **Riders must use the appropriate hand placement** - snaffles, bosals, and bitless bridles should be shown two handed, shanked bits of any kind must be shown one handed. Gaited and western dressage may use 2 hands regardless of bit type. Please check AQHA rule book for proper hand placement on split, closed, and Rommel reins.
- Boots, wraps, and other leg protection are permissible as long as it does not hinder judging (example: no boots in halter, or showmanship please! No bell boots in trail classes)
- **No training aids of any kind allowed in any classes (exception- martingales in over fences classes are allowed).**
- Closed reins on western bridles will not be penalized unless it affects the performance of the horse.
- Schooling attire is acceptable (polos, sweatshirts, t-shirts, jeans). However, NO shorts, tank tops, clothes that have holes in them. Must wear boots. Exhibitors in the In Hand Classes may wear tennis shoes. No Crocs, flip flops or open toed shoes. Cold weather gear is allowed!
- Helmets are required for all Youth Classes (yes, even in hand classes such as showmanship) and ALL Over Fences Classes (regardless of age).
- Youth is any person 18 and under as of January 1, 2023.
- Peewee is any child 10 and under as of 1/1/2024. Pee Wee Riders may NOT cross enter into any classes where a canter or lope is demonstrated nor any over fences classes. Pee Wee Riders may not cross over into the lead line division.
- Vintage Horseman is 40 years of age or over as of 1/1/2024. These exhibitors may cross over into other divisions.

- Youth may enter the open halter classes (classes 1-3) however!!! Only class 5 Youth Halter will be counted in the youth overall points.
- Lead line is open to children 10 and under as of 1/1/2024.
- All lead line horses must wear a bridle. A bridle and halter may be worn together.
- The “leader” must be attached in all classes, even showmanship.
- Those that show in the Lead Line Division may not cross enter into other divisions where they would be showing solo, except costume.
- Helmets required to be worn securely in all lead line classes!!
- A novice rider is a rider of any age in their 1st or 2nd year of showing. These exhibitors may cross over into other divisions.
 - ***Walk Trot Division- Those entering the Walk Trot Division may be of any age or riding ability, but they cannot enter any other class where a canter or lope is demonstrated.** If entries warrant the class may be split into youth and adult.
 - Green Horse is open to horses in their first or second year of showing. If the horse has shown only in-hand classes in the past and is newly shown under saddle, the horse may only enter the under-saddle classes. Hunters and Western are combined except in Pattern classes.
 - Miniature Horse/VSE Division: Any equine up to 46” may participate in this division. In-hand Over fences jump heights are exhibitor’s choice. Jumps may be verticals or cross rails. Show your horse off!!
 - AQHA, AMHR, and USEF rules apply, unless otherwise stated. Please be familiar with these rules as there have been updates!
 - Dressage Riders- You may exhibit in both levels of dressage classes. To qualify for a divisional championship, you must compete in at least one dressage test in the division.
 - Dressage Suitability- The judge will examine the horse on the rail at the walk/trot/canter, both directions. Halt and stand. The judge will be looking for- pure rhythm in the gaits, acceptance of contact, suppleness, as well as willingness. Show lengthening at the trot and canter (if canter class) will be called for in the Suitability classes. Unlike Dressage Seat Equitation, these Classes focus on the Horse and

not solely on the rider's position and ability to apply the aids.

- Dressage Seat Equitation-Judging the position, seat, and use of aids of the rider, as required at appropriate level of class. Rail work.
 - **Those that ride Dressage tests, unless you pay for feedback you may or may not receive a dressage scorecard, this is judge’s discretion.**
 - An exhibitor may show as many horses as they choose, per class. A horse may only be shown by one exhibitor per HALTER class. Horses may be shown by multiple exhibitors in the same class only for under saddle classes, driving, and in hand performance type classes. If an adult and youth show the same horse in the longe line class, the class will be split into youth and adult.
 - In open under saddle classes, a horse/exhibitor combo may only show one discipline type.
 - Open Driving division is open to all breeds and all aged exhibitors. A safe suitable vehicle must be used.
 - To be considered for a Series Championship you must participate in at least two shows in the series. To be considered for a division championship at each show, you must participate in two of the classes in the division.
 - If there is a tie for a championship the exhibitor with the most 1st placings will win the tie. If there is a further tie the number of classes entered, and additional placings will be considered.
 - Judge’s decision is final. If there is a technical question regarding a class, show management may ask the judge to review a class. The judge reserves the right to agree to or decline to review the results. This is the only reason a class will be put under review. Results will be made available as soon as the judge has concluded judging. The timeframe will depend on the number of entries and may not be immediately available.
 - If you would like feedback, the request needs to be made via the online entry form and the judge’s fee of \$3 per horse/rider combo, per division must be included with your fees, prior to the entry deadline. NO EXPLANATION OF PLACINGS WILL BE

PROVIDED TO EXHIBITORS WHO DID NOT PAY THE FEEDBACK FEE AND ARE UNHAPPY WITH PLACING IN A CLASS.

Judge's scorecards will **not** be posted or publicly released. Only technical questions will be reviewed/allowed. Some judges are more verbose in their feedback, show management makes every effort to ensure actionable feedback is provided, however it cannot be guaranteed. **Those that ride Dressage tests, unless you pay for feedback you may or may not receive a dressage scorecard, this is judge's discretion.**

- Ribbons/awards will be mailed at **the CONCLUSION** of the series! See info on awards at end of this document. Awards are custom made so they may take several months to receive. The timetable for videos is as follows:

DEADLINE IS 10PM EST

- o All videos for the April 28th show must be filmed between April 1 and April 28, 2024 . Submission deadline is April 28 at 10 PM EST.
- o All videos for the May 26th show must be filmed between April 29th and May 26th 2024. Submission deadline is May 26th at 10 PM EST.
- All videos for the June 30th show must be filmed between May 27th and June 30, 2024. Submission deadline IS June 30 at 10 PM EST.
- All videos for the July 28th show must be filmed between July 1st and July 28th Submission deadline is July 28th, 2024 at 10 PM EST.
- Videos may be used for more than one class in a show as long as they precisely show the designated gait calls/pattern prescribed for the class. Example- you may use your Walk Trot class video in the Go As You Please Class. You may not use a Walk Trot Canter video in a Walk Trot class or Go As You Please class.
 - **Classes that allow you to Pick Your Test/Pattern, Freestyle- Videos must be of tests or patterns that have not been used in the current show. Example- If you show in Class 111 USDF Intro A, you may not submit USDF Intro A Test for Class 101 Freestyle Dressage.**
- ALL videos should include a timestamp. This may be a snippet at the beginning of your video showing a cell phone or watch displaying the date or simply a person announcing the Class, date and time. You may also use a timestamp app

that can be downloaded to your recording device. If you need assistance, please ask. If a video does not have a timestamp and show management has not been notified prior to the deadline, the entry may be penalized or DQ'ed by the judge.

- All classes should be filmed from the vantage point of the judge. The best spot for rail classes is the center of the ring! For dressage, please film from C. The pattern books will include a "best view" icon, however it is not required that the video be filmed from that spot, due to varying spaces. Filming using landscape mode is preferred by out judges.
- Halter Classes- Many people film solo with the assistance of a tripod or filming device. To accommodate our solo folks, during the presentation in halter, you may have a person walk around you or you may set your horse up for the camera four times, showing all 4 views to the camera.
 - Senior horse halter classes are open to horses 6 years of age and older.
 - **MOST COLORFUL AT HALTER-** Open to any horse that demonstrates a color pattern such as paint, pinto, appaloosa. Class will be judged 100% on color. This class will not count towards any monthly or overall awards. The horse that accumulates the most points in this class during the series will be awarded a special prize.
 - Showmanship classes will include a pattern. Having a person walk around the horse is not necessary, but the exhibitor must change quarters/halves at least twice. Show that your horse can set up and stand still for inspection.
 - All rail classes will require the exhibitor to demonstrate a walk, trot/jog, and in classes where there is a canter/lope, that is to be shown as well. Reverse and repeat. Exhibitors may also be asked to back. Check Class information found in the pattern book for additional details. If these gaits are not followed the rider may be penalized at the judge's discretion.
 - Patterns for classes will be posted to the Facebook Info page and show info page at www.cheeryacres.com. A copy may also be requested by emailing cheeryacres@gmail.com

- In the ground poles class jump standards are not required, simply the use of the ground poles will suffice. All disciplines are welcome in the ground pole classes. Trot only.

*Any over fences class- Jumps must be a minimum height of 12", GROUND POLES ARE NOT ALLOWED FOR CLASSES 20, 102-104. Cross rails or verticals are allowed. Do what shows your horse off best.

- In Bareback Equitation classes, the horse must wear a bridle. You may not show in just a halter. No bareback pads.
- Ranch Horse Division- Western pleasure horses may cross over, but minimize the bling! No fake tails.
- Please be mindful of your filming! If the judge cannot see a clear video, they cannot judge you accordingly. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to make sure the video is appropriate, follows directions and follows the pattern instructions (if applicable).
- Fences in all over fences (Hunter Type- Under Saddle and In Hand) Jumps must be a minimum height of 12", GROUND POLES ARE NOT ALLOWED FOR CLASSES 20,87, 102-104.. May be vertical jumps or cross rails. Exhibitors may pick their own course, but the course must have 4-6 jumps and must show one change of direction. Do what shows your horse off best.

- Ground Driving Class- May use a harness, surcingle, or saddle to run long lines thru. Exhibitor may choose a pattern of their choice. Please submit with entry. May include obstacles or may demonstrate groundwork without obstacles. Must include a walk, trot, and back.
- Open Liberty Class: Your horse will be set free in an enclosed area, with no halter/bridle and demonstrate gaits at liberty for 1 minute and 30 seconds. At the end of the time period, you have 2 minutes to catch your horse and show the judge you have successfully caught your horse. Music may be played in the background, but it is not necessary for this show. To be judged on freedom

of movement, use of space, change of gaits/direction and ease of catch.

- OPEN LIBERTY OBSTACLE CLASS- Obstacle class performed on the ground. Horse to be shown at liberty (no halter and lead rope). Course will consist of 5-8 obstacles. Neck rope may be used, but there will be a 5 point penalty each time the neck rope is touched.
- IN HAND DRESSAGE- Must use a test from Dressage Riders Online or Six Feet on the Ground. Tests from other organizations must be approved before use or will result in a DQ.
- If the pattern calls for markers or cones (usually in showmanship, horsemanship, and equitation pattern classes) they need to be visible to the judge or you may be penalized.
- It is the exhibitor's responsibility to know and supply required equipment. If you need to use alternative equipment please let show management know.
- In Freestyle classes the exhibitor must provide a copy of a **diagram** of their pattern.
- In trail classes, please use AQHA Measurements between obstacles. If you need to adjust, please make that request to management.
- Due to the varying spaces/atmospheres exhibitors may request course adjustments. These requests need to be made prior to submitting your video. Please ensure that the space you have is adequate to show the horse/exhibitor for proper judging.
- Classes may be combined, split, or canceled at the discretion of the show management.
- All equine liability laws apply to this show.
- By providing your video to the Cheery Acres Online Horse Show you are aware that the exhibitor's image and likeness may be visible to the public. If you would like accommodations to this please email cheeryacres@gmail.com For more information or questions, please email Cheeryacres@gmail.com

Class Awards: WE HAVE 4 RIBBON OPTIONS TO CHOOSE FROM

Option A: During the series, all exhibitors will receive points for their placings in each individual class. The top ten horse/rider combination in each class for the series will receive rosette awards. The top ten exhibitors in each class **will not** receive individual flat ribbons for each class at each show. One rosette will be awarded at the end of the series. If there is a tie, the exhibitor that received the most 1st place ribbons in the class will rank higher, if that doesn't settle it the number of shows entered, or lesser placings will be considered.

If you do not qualify for a Top 10 class award, you will receive individual flat ribbons for each placing in the class in which you did not rank in the top ten.

Option B: Exhibitors may opt to receive individual flat ribbons for their classes instead of the Top 10 rosette, but you will not be able to receive both.

Option C: Exhibitors may choose to receive no ribbons for their classes during the series. You may also choose not to receive championship ribbons as well.

Option D: Exhibitors may choose to receive Top 10 Rosettes for their series class placing AND may also receive flat ribbons for all classes they placed in during the series. If you choose option D, you will be responsible for the cost of the flat ribbons. An invoice will be sent to you at the conclusion of the series and must be paid before any ribbons are mailed.

High point awards will be dependent on the different sponsors that may assist the show. You may win ribbons, you may win prizes, you may win both. Every effort will be made to advertise awards during the series.

Series End Special High Point awards:

Academy Rider Award

This award is for Academy Riders who may not always have access to the same horse for lessons/filming. Awarded to the Academy exhibitor that accumulates the most points throughout the series (based on rider points, not horse/rider combo. Academy Rider status must be declared on entry form including trainer information. See class list for eligible classes.

Overall high point exhibitor (Multiple horses)

Awarded to the exhibitor that accumulates the most points throughout the series using multiple horses. Awarded to the exhibitor (not based on horse/rider combo).

Divisions not included in this award: Pee Wee, Leadline, Novice Rider, Green Horse, Vintage, OTTB, and Spots and Splashes). You must show 2+ horses in a show to obtain the points.

OTTB Classes:

Open to all Off the Track Thoroughbreds. You must provide your OTTB's TIP number and Registered Name (Show name or Jockey Club Name) in order to be eligible. TIP number for horse/rider combo must be on record with the Jockey Club to be eligible. Spots & Splashes Classes (see eligible classes in division championships):

Open to all horses that have Paint, Pinto, or Appaloosa characteristics. Sorry! NO SOLID COLORS ALLOWED, regardless of registration. Horses DO NOT need to be registered as paint, pintos, or appaloosas, just need to have the coat characteristics. If you have questions please email!

Trusty Steed Award

Open to all horses. This award will go to the horse that earns the most points during the series. Horse must be shown by multiple exhibitors at the show. The horse is eligible to receive points in ALL divisions and classes.

Most Colorful at Halter- Awarded to the high point horse in class 4.

YEAR END AWARDS

Cheery Acres Year End Awards- High point CHAMPION will be awarded in the following categories. Must show in both the Spring and Fall Series 2024 and meet series qualifications (Must show in at least 2 shows in each series (Spring & Winter) to qualify for year-end, in the respective division).

Year End Awards:

Adult Exhibitor- Includes all divisions except, Spots & Splashes, OTTB, Novice, Green Horse, Vintage, and Jackpot classes. May show multiple horses.

Youth Exhibitor- Includes all divisions except Spots & Splashes, OTTB, Leadline, Pee Wee, Novice, Green Horse, and Jackpots. May show multiple horses.

Horse of the Year- Includes all divisions except Spots & Splashes, OTTB, Leadline, Pee Wee, Vintage, and Jackpots. May be shown by multiple exhibitors.

Year End Divisional Awards: High point **Champion and Reserve Champions** will be awarded in the following categories. Must show in both the Spring and Fall Series 2024 and meet series qualifications (Must show in at least 2 shows in each series and must show in at least two classes in the division each month to qualify for year-end). Classes include will mirror the divisional series awards.
