WORLD SERIES SHOW PROGRAM

World Series Shows are Double Point Shows for the Versatility Program. To qualify as a World Series Show, the show must provide a minimum of three (3) of the following classes for both rail and versatility:

Please note: To obtain points with TWHBEA, owners and riders must be current members and in good standing with TWHBEA and horses must be registered with TWHBEA. Again, the World Series Shows are Versatility Double Point Shows for all Exhibitors!

YOUTH MEDALLION CLASS

TWHBEA will provide a medallion, first through fifth place ribbons, and premiums for (up to) the top five placings to any horse show that includes either or both Youth Medallion classes in their slate of classes.

Guidelines for the Youth Medallion Classes are:

- Open to all youth riders, age 17 and under (age as of January 1).
- Ownership of the horse is not required. Stallion are not allowed.
- Two Medallion classes may be offered: Youth Medallion Performance and Youth Medallion Pleasure. In both classes, horses should perform all three gaits: flat walk, running walk and canter. Show managers may choose to offer one or both of these classes.
- Horses entered in either of these classes should not be charged an entry fee.
- Horses entered in either of these classes at S.H.O.W. affiliated horse shows will be charged a \$5 inspection fee.
- Premiums for both Youth Medallion classes will be: \$75, \$50, \$40, \$30, \$20 (to be reimbursed byTWHBEA)

2.	Include the "TWHBEA Affiliated Show" logo on the class sheet, printed programs, and in preshow advertising (logo provided upon request).		
3.	Send a copy of the class sheet to TWHBEA prior to the show.		
4.	Submit full results within 14 days after the show. Results must list all horses showing in the class (not just ribbon winners) and include the horse's name, rider's name, and owner's name/address. Electronic submission encouraged.
