TWHBEA/Glenn C. Dowell Family Undergraduate Scholarship *TWHBEA/Glenn C. Dowell Family Graduate Scholarship*

AWARD: \$5,000 total (number of recipients TBD)

TWHBEA and the Glenn C. Dowell Family recognize that youth are vital to the successful future of the Tennessee Walking Horse industry and awards both graduate and undergraduate scholarships each year. Scholarships can be used for accredited colleges, junior colleges, universities, or trade schools. The scholarship amounts are based on availability of funds and the selection is based equally on academic performance, extracurricular activities, and equine involvement.

- ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**
- Must be a member of TWHBEA for 18 months prior to application deadline: June 15.
 - Cannot apply for the scholarship before junior year of high school.
 - Cannot be over the age of 24 (for undergraduates).

Jane Hardy Meredith Memorial Scholarship

AWARD: \$1,000 each to 2 recipients

Jane Hardy Meredith was well known and loved and highly successful in every aspect of her life. The Tennessee Walking Horse industry was a huge part of Jane and it occupied a big piece of her heart ever since she started riding as a child. When she became involved with Tennessee Walking Horses, she pursued that with all the love and passion that was synonymous with Jane. She was a beautiful rider, owner, breeder and advocate for the Tennessee Walking Horse. She served in leadership roles within the industry including as a board member of the Tennessee Walking Horse Breeders' and Exhibitors' Association. She was always known for her beauty, grace, loyalty and for standing up for everything she believed.

- ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**
- Must be or have a family member who is a member of TWHBEA.
 - Cannot apply for the scholarship before junior year of high school.
 - Must re-apply each year of eligibility.
 - Cannot be over the age of 24.

TWHBEA/SWHBA Scholarship

AWARD: \$1,000 each to 2 recipients

The Southwest Walking Horse Breeders Association (SWHBA) ceased operations after many decades of service to the Tennessee Walking Horse community in Texas, New Mexico, Louisiana, Oklahoma, and Arkansas. In a final act of generosity and forward-thinking stewardship, the organization has donated its remaining assets to the Tennessee Walking Horse Breeders' Foundation to establish a scholarship fund that will benefit students involved in the breed.

- ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**
- Must be a member of TWHBEA or TWHYA for 12 months prior to application deadline: June 15.
 - Cannot apply for the scholarship before junior year of high school.
 - Undergraduate applicants cannot be over the age of 24.
 - Preference may be given to applicants from Texas, New Mexico, Louisiana, Oklahoma, or Arkansas.

W.R. Mitchell Memorial Scholarship

AWARD: \$1,000 each to 1 recipient

The W.R. Mitchell Memorial Scholarship is a \$1,000 scholarship funded by the Mitchell family in honor of W.R. Mitchell of Eight Mile, Alabama. Mr. Mitchell was a lifelong supporter of the Tennessee Walking Horse industry and proudly rode Go Boy's Scooter to the Owner-Amateur 50 & Over World Championship in 1964, an accomplishment he cherished and shared with his family throughout his life.

In addition to his love for horses, Mr. Mitchell was the owner of W.R. Mitchell Contractors, where he built a respected reputation in pipeline construction, specializing in water and sewer utilities. He was also an avid hunter, fisherman, and outdoorsman who valued hard work, dedication, and family. This scholarship is presented in his memory to help support future generations in pursuing their educational goals.

- ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:**
- Must be or have a family member who is a member of TWHBEA.
 - Cannot apply for the scholarship before junior year of high school.
 - Must re-apply each year of eligibility.
 - Cannot be over the age of 24.

The Tennessee Walking Horse Breeders' and Exhibitors' Association will award scholarships based upon availability of funds. The scholarships will be awarded based on academic performance (1/3), extracurricular activities (1/3), equine involvement (1/3). Scholarship recipients' funds will be paid directly to the educational institution for educational expenses at the College, Junior College, University, or Trade School of their choice.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- The application **MUST** be typed. When extra space is needed to complete answers on the application, please include additional sheets of paper.
- You **MUST** include a head and shoulders photograph of yourself with your application. The photograph should be of a quality for reproduction in publications. Photographs must be color and a minimum of 3" x 5" in size, maximum of 8" x 10".
- **High School/College Transcripts:** An official copy of your high school transcript and/or college transcript **MUST** be sent directly from the school. **Copies from the applicant will not be accepted.**
- **College/Graduate School Entrance Exams:** If not included on high school/college transcript, a copy of entrance exam reports **MUST** be sent with your completed application if applying for graduate scholarship.
